The NAPA Conference Organizing Committee (COC) is pleased to announce the theme "Global Food Security through Agricultural Transformation" for the Biennial Conference. A limited number of travel grants is available to support students and young scholars from developing countries. To qualify for these travel grants, you must submit the abstract before the deadline and you must have your abstract accepted for presentation in the conference.

Outstanding presentation awards for students:

The association will select the outstanding first, second, and third place winners for both poster and paper presentations by students. The winners will receive cash prizes (First: \$250, Second: \$150 and Third: \$100) and plaques.





Talk Summary

Dr. Y. B. Thapa will talk about 'Poverty Alleviation and Prosperity: Strategy, Policies, and Programs' to support economically disadvantaged communities towards entrepreneurship, skilled employment and transformations using the framework of multidimensional poverty indices. He will highlight poverty rates/trends in relation to the occupational patterns and labour market; economic growth rates by industry in relation to product market and trade; investment patterns by agency and industry in relation to the fiscal/monetary policy, and financial markets, and poverty reduction approaches in Nepal and her neighbors with a focus on the Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI)-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) implementation mechanism, and institutional capital. Similarly, he will also discuss the linkages among poverty, employment, social protection, and investment with particular emphasis on the role of agriculture, food, and nutrition activities, and other basic services.

Speaker: Dr. Thapa holds M.Sc in
Agriculture and PhD in Economics. He is ViceChair, Poverty Alleviation Fund, and Adjunct
Professor, Agriculture and Forestry University.
He has worked in the capacity of Member,
National Planning Commission, and Poverty


Call for Students' Writing Contest
